

It's ok/ Icannot change it


Etiquette.

Otherwise smart casual is the way to go at the office – start-ups tend to be just casual.




Gifts for business partners

Lunch dishes (and problems they might cause).




Sausage

Franconian sausages with sauerkraut – Don't ever eat them with ketchup!




Brezn
